Late-Breaking Clinical Trials	(NEW for 2026!) Late-Breaking Clinical Trial (LBCT) Sessions showcase groundbreaking clinical research that is shaping the future of heart rhythm care. Each presenter will deliver an 8-minute presentation highlighting the background, methodology, key findings, and clinical implications of their study. Following each presentation, a panel of three expert moderators will serve as commentators, leading an interactive discussion and audience Q&A to explore the study's significance, practical application, and future impact on the field. Moderator Responsibilities • Introduce each presenter and their Late-Breaking Clinical Trial. • Serve as expert commentators by providing clinical insights and perspective on each study. • Facilitate the post-presentation discussion and audience Q&A following each presentation. • Encourage audience engagement and discussion while ensuring all key questions are addressed. • Keep the session on schedule, allowing equal time for each presentation and discussion. Presenters • Deliver an 8-minute presentation summarizing the Late-Breaking Clinical Trial, including the study background, methods, key results, and clinical implications. • Participate in the moderated discussion and audience Q&A immediately following the presentation.
